

## Overview:

NTIS is pleased to announce the launch of the new National Technical Reports Library (NTRL), a new fee-based subscription product from NTIS. NTRL guarantees libraries and technical information professionals easy access to the full text of documents from the National Technical Information Service's comprehensive collection of federally-funded technical reports. The NTRL provides search access to NTIS Database metadata (over 2,000,000 records) with links to approximately 500,000 digitized documents.

The Top Source agency contributors within NTRL include: Department of Defense, Department of Energy, National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Interior, Department of Transportation, Department of Commerce, Department of Agriculture, Department of Justice and Department of Health and Human Services.

## The Database:

The National Technical Reports Library fills a recognised void in access to a large collection of historical and current government technical reports that exists in many academic, public, government, and corporate libraries. Through NTRL, NTIS now provides a more comprehensive offering that delivers high-quality government technical content in all subject areas directly and seamlessly to the user's desktop.

A subscribing organisation's students, faculty, staff and on-site library patrons may access the National Technical Reports Library for non-commercial use from Internet-connected organization-wide locations. Users at the subscribing organisation may access NTRL from remote locations and branch or satellite facility through the organisation's server. Annual subscription pricing is based on full-time equivalent (FTE) enrolment or employees. The National Technical Information Service acquires, indexes, abstracts, and archives the largest collection of U.S. government-sponsored technical reports in existence. The NTRL offers access to these authenticated government technical reports to libraries and technical information users.
